ALL TRAPPED CATS MUST BE REPORTED TO COUNCIL AND THE RANGER MUST ATTEND TO ENSURE THE CAT IS IDENTIFIED AND REGISTERED.

^{**} Your bond will be refunded by cheque or EFT following the return of the cat trap in the condition which it was hired out to you providing there are no outstanding fees.

Council's Hire Cat Traps are not for the use of catching residential family pets. The hire of the trap is intended to catch Feral Cats that are causing an issue at your property. Failure to adhere to this may result in forfeit of your bond.

If you are having issues with cats from neighbouring properties, there are a number of ways to discourage them from entering your property. You can find information about this on the Internet.

Under current New South Wales Legislation, (Companion Animals Act 1998) the only current restrictions for cats are as follows:

Cats prohibited in some public places

- (1) Cats are prohibited in the following places—
- (a) Food preparation/consumption areas (meaning any public place, or part of a public place, that is within 10 metres of any apparatus provided in that public place or part for the preparation of food for human consumption or for the consumption of food by humans).
- (b) Wildlife protection areas (meaning any public place or any part of a public place set apart by the local authority for the protection of wildlife and in which the local authority ordered that cats are prohibited for the purposes of the protection of wildlife and in which, or near the boundaries of which, there are conspicuously exhibited by the local authority at reasonable intervals notices to the effect that cats are prohibited in or on that public place).

Suggestions for Cat Trap set up:

Traps are only to be set from Monday to Thursday nights, as Council Rangers cannot pick up trapped cats on the weekend.

Using a small can of tuna or a pouch of cat food in a small container works well as the aroma from these wet foods carries more than dry food.

Place the trap in your desired location. Lift the solid metal sheet at the end and place the food inside the trap. Close the metal sheet and set the trap using the mechanism at the other end of the trap.

Suggestions for after a Cat is captured.

Place the trap in a corner out of direct sunlight and if possible cover the trap with an old towel or sheet.

Contact Council as soon as you can to arrange for the Ranger to attend and deal with the cat.

All trapped cats must be reported to Council and the Ranger must attend to ensure the cat is identified and registered.
